CONGRESS PASSED NDAA

In August 2018, the US introduced the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) containing Section 889 prohibiting "certain telecommunications and video surveillance services or equipment."



NON-COMPLIANT MANUFACTURERS

In August 2020, the ban went into effect. Businesses selling equipment by Chinese companies expose the U.S. government to significant vulnerabilities.




WHO DOES THIS AFFECT?

Although NDAA section 889 affects government facilities, it also applies to any federally funded organization. If your camera equipment is on the ban list, you'll need to convert to an NDAA-compliant surveillance solution.
